CONFIRMATION REGISTRATION

In the Archdiocese of Ottawa, children age eleven and older (*grade six and up*) may register for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Confirmation is the third Sacrament of Initiation, which includes Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. If you would like your child to prepare for and receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at Holy Name of Mary Parish in the spring of 2018, registration will be held on the weekends of **September 3rd & 10th** following the 9:00am & 10:30am Masses. Forms will be available at the church those weekends. Please bring a copy of your child's baptismal certificate.

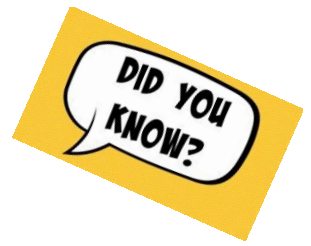
TRAVELLERS PRAYER

175th ANNIVERSARY TRIVIA

The priests of our parish come from diverse backgrounds and have stayed from a few weeks and months to several years. This week we look at the early years of our parish.

Father John McDonald , born in Scotland, served our Mission Parish from 1823 - 1838. He was revered and respected among all denominations, remember he was the one who walked all over the county to serve the needs of the parishioners!

Very Rev. J.H. McDonough, born in Ireland and succeeded Fr. McDonald in 1838 -1845. The fruits of his labors were seen in both his parish of Perth and the mission in Almonte where under his guidance both towns had churches built.

Rev. Terence Smith was also born in Ireland. After his ordination he ministered to the mission of Richmond and the mission of Ramsay, now the town of Almonte. The parochial register lists his years of service to us as 1845-1846 and then again in 1848 after a brief return to his birthplace.

Rev. P. O'Connell filled in while Fr. Smith was in Ireland from 1846 - 1848. Little seems to be known of his background, other than he was zealous, respected and kindly remembered!

Rev. Edward Vaughan was born in Ireland and tended the flocks in Huntley, Pakenham, Darling, Lavant and Ramsay. He was an eloquent speaker, and served from 1848-1868. Due to the constant travel and rigorous duties of such a widespread responsibility, he suffered from failing health which led to his retirement to monastery life of prayer and grace.

Father A. O'Malley another Irish born priest served from 1868-1872. He was inspirational to his parishioners at the time of the fire in 1868 and remained close even after moving on to St. Michael's.

Rev. Doctor Remi Faure was parish priest from 1872 -1875. He was a native of France and was the inspiration behind continued work on the stone Church. The sacristy and the priest's house were all built under his direction as well as the building of the Separate School. He also established the Father Mathew Temperance Association which undertook works of charity, financial help in addition to the cause of temperance (abstaining from alcohol).

Father E.J.J. Stenson is listed as priest from 1875-1878. He was the overseer for the Consecration of the new church. A devout priest who was instrumental in extending the sacraments to those in isolation or who were out of touch, he established the Association of St. Francis de Sales and organized the beginnings of the St. Vincent de Paul Society for the poor in the parish.

Reverend John F. Coffey, M.A. Was a native of Ottawa and although not officially installed as parish priest he administered spiritual and temporal affairs from 1878-1881. He is best remembered as a great Catholic journalist who edited The Catholic Record at London, Ontario. He continued the work of the St. Vincent de Paul Society and established The Way of the Cross.

Rev. B. Casey was with us for only six months in 1882, as an interim priest.

Very Rev. Canon Declan F. Foley came to us in 1882 and stayed until 1903. It is due to his careful notes of events and parish life that we have such vast historical information. Our mission parish of St. Declan's in Darling can be attributed to him. He revitalized the temperance society with financial support to the school and a community hall, organized the Rosary Society for married women to pray, visit and care for the sick and do good works. He formed the Sodality of the Immaculate Conception for the younger women of the church and also formed a branch of the Catholic Mutual Benefit Society, an early credit union and insurance mutual. A stained glass window at the back of the Church is dedicated to the Society.

All of these men were the foundation of early St Mary's, giving spiritual guidance to those who were trying to live their faith even without an established physical church for many years.
